We strive to ensure that all interactions with clients, team members, the community, and partners embody respect, understanding, and empathy.

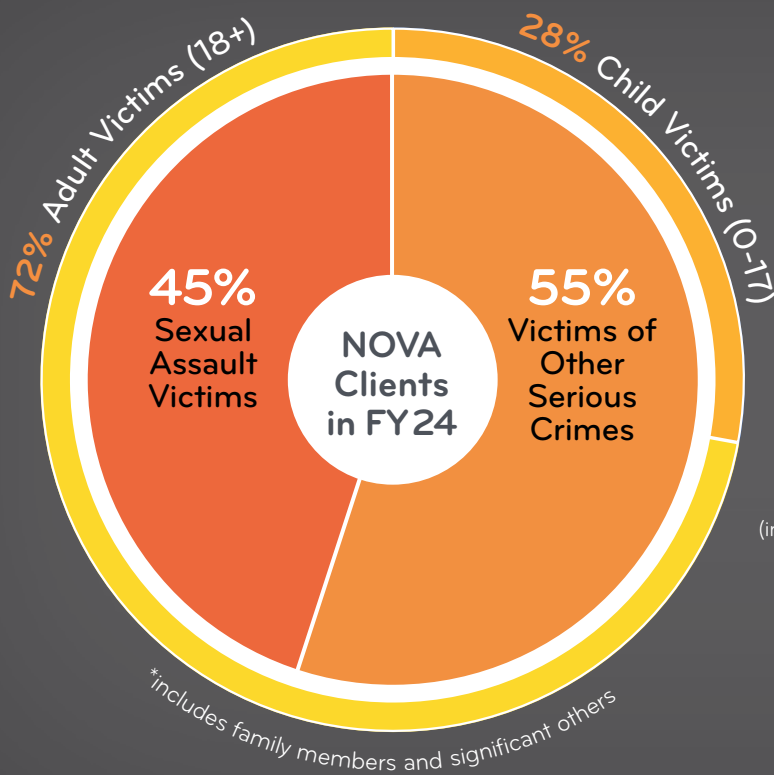
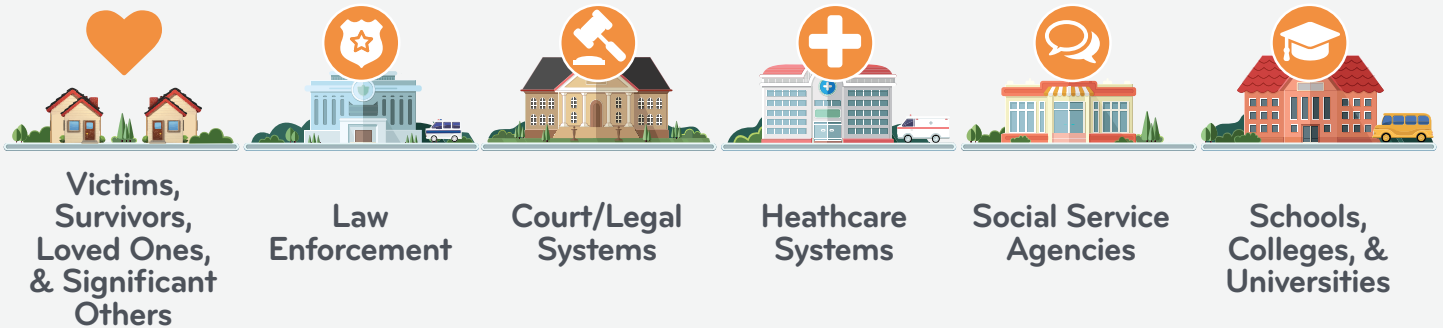

Helpline & Crisis Response

The 24/7 Helpline has been a core part of NOVA's work for decades.

As the main entry point for clients seeking services, the Helpline meets victims and their families exactly where they are, offering empathy, respect, and confidential support. Whether callers are experiencing an acute crisis, processing a past trauma, or just seeking information, they receive immediate guidance and learn the options available to them.

Many know NOVA as a resource for individuals seeking support, but we also work at the community level in times of tragedy. The **Keystone Crisis Intervention Team (KCIT)**, offered through NOVA and serving all of Pennsylvania, steps in to help communities move through shock and grief in the wake of serious crimes. KCIT responds and adapts to situations as they unfold — supporting decision-makers, victims, professionals, and the wider community affected by these crises.

In FY24, KCIT expanded its impact by recruiting, training, and scheduling volunteers to provide emotional support to Bucks County Forensic Nurses after they conduct forensic exams. This added layer of support helps prevent secondary trauma and promotes the long-term well-being of nurses who care for victims of violence. More than 25% of KCIT's volunteers signed up to participate in this new initiative—demonstrating strong interest in expanding the reach of KCIT's trauma-informed care model.

Forensic Exams

Victims of sexual assault and interpersonal violence require highly specialized care, which is provided by NOVA's team of trained Forensic Nurse Examiners (FNEs) in Bucks County.

These nurses offer critical medical services while NOVA advocates provide compassionate, in-person support—accompanying clients to the emergency room, explaining their options, and remaining by their side throughout the exam and in the days that follow.

In FY24, NOVA's Forensic Nurses also expanded their outreach to first responders, offering education on recognizing the signs of non-fatal strangulation and the serious, often delayed health complications that can result. This outreach strengthens early identification and intervention, ultimately improving health outcomes and safety for victims.

The Bucks County Children's Advocacy Center (CAC), housed at NOVA, is one of few facilities of its caliber in the region

The CAC is a critical resource for families, bringing together professionals in all relevant fields to investigate crimes against children and provide expert support. Keeping the child's best interests front and center, the CAC serves as a safe haven for young victims while helping parents and caregivers pursue justice and healing.

Advocacy

The aftermath of a crime creates both emotional and logistical challenges for the survivor.

Victim advocacy services at NOVA support clients through the complexities of the criminal justice system and legal process, ensuring their rights are known and respected every step of the way. NOVA advocates provide police interview and court accompaniment, post-conviction support, and other services that can ease some of the burdens victims carry.

In FY24, NOVA's Victim Advocacy Department expanded services to better support Spanish-speaking clients, responding to a noticeable increase in the number of clients who speak Spanish. Key materials, including the Criminal Justice System Reference Guide, were translated to ensure accessible, equitable support throughout the legal process.

Advocates also responded to a growing number of elder scam cases, assisting victims in seeking compensation for financial losses through the Victim Compensation Assistance Program. By staying informed about current scam trends and actively participating in senior fairs and community trainings, NOVA is working to both support victims and prevent future cases through targeted education and outreach.

The Victims' Compensation Assistance Program in Pennsylvania provides financial assistance to victims of crime and their families to help cover expenses resulting from the crime. NOVA Advocates can assist victims with filing VCAP claims.



Counseling

In Bucks County, victims and survivors always have a place to turn for professional support.

NOVA's state-of-the-art counseling services are available at no cost to the client, and encompass a broad range of trauma-informed methodologies, like Trauma-Focused Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (TFCBT), Trauma Informed Body Movement, and Eye Movement Desensitization and Reprocessing (EMDR). NOVA develops customized, short-term treatment plans that begin the healing process in a safe and supportive environment.

- Individual Counseling
- Group Counseling
- Trauma-Focused Cognitive Behavioral Therapy
- Trauma Informed Body Movement
- Eye Movement Desensitization and Reprocessing

Prevention Education

InNOVative prevention programs building a world free from violence, where every person is valued and respected.

Since 1984, NOVA's prevention programs have been guided by our belief that creating safe and caring communities is key to reducing crime and the impact of victimization. Our prevention staff is passionate about NOVA's mission and has expertise in facilitating engaging, high-quality, trauma-focused educational programming. We offer programs and trainings for students, educators, child-serving professionals, community leaders, businesses, caregivers, and foster care families.

PROGRAMS FOR STUDENTS

NOVA provides a wide variety of innovative, supportive, and trauma-focused learning experiences. To help students thrive in their relationships, both in real life and online, our programs advance critical thinking skills, respectful interpersonal boundaries, healthy relationships, and resources for support. Programs are age-appropriate and available for preschool, elementary, middle school, and high school students.

PEER EDUCATION

NOVA understands that effective learning happens in many ways. Peer education is when students help and learn from each other. For more than a decade, NOVA has collaborated to train high school students to be peer educators and present "Encourage Upstanders" to younger students in their district. This education method helps high school students connect with younger students, provide meaningful engagement and support, and promote the positive Upstander message.

PROGRAMS FOR INDIVIDUALS WITH AUTISM AND IDD

Healthy and safe relationships are central for a full life. Some individuals may need extra support in forming and maintaining safe, healthy relationships. NOVA created programs specifically for neurodivergent children, teens, and adults to develop strengths and provide sustainable personal safety education for happy and healthy lives.

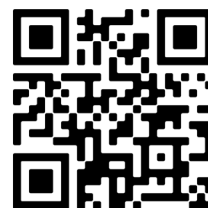

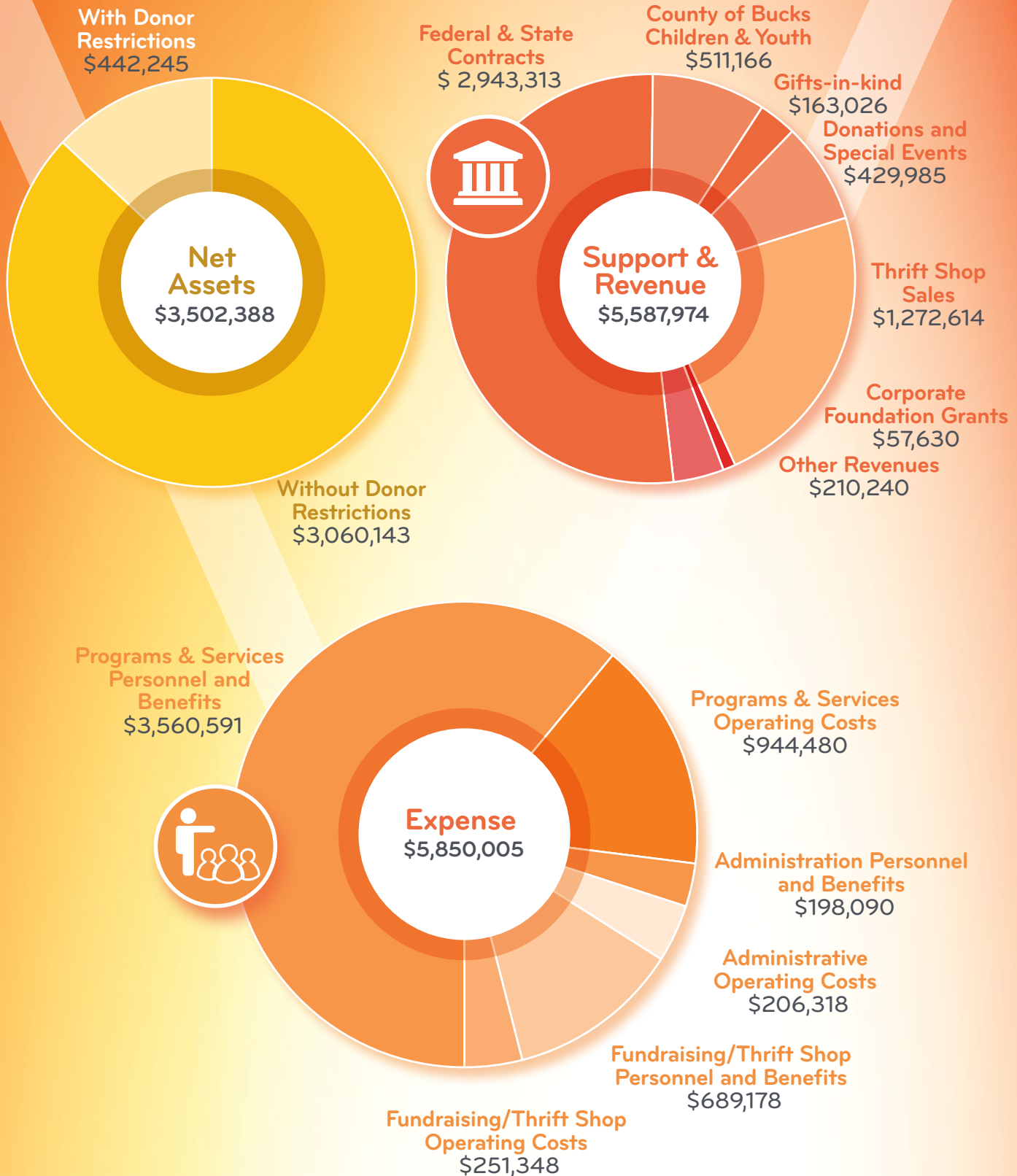

Community Foundation Support

Norman Raab Foundation

NOVA is grateful to the Norman Raab Foundation for awarding a generous **\$25,000 grant**. A longtime partner since 2007, the Foundation's continued support has enabled NOVA to expand the reach of our *Upstanders Unite* program. Designed for 4th graders at a pivotal stage in their development, this multi-session curriculum fosters mutual respect, self-confidence, and positive peer engagement in schools across Bucks County.

Foundations Community Partnership

Thanks to a **\$10,000 grant** from Foundations Community Partnership, NOVA launched a pilot training for healthcare professionals: *Understanding Child Abuse and Trafficking Indicators in a Clinical Setting*. This initiative was designed to help medical providers identify signs of abuse and trafficking in pediatric patients. Funding supported both curriculum development and training delivery, with the goal of reaching 50–100 professionals across Bucks County. NOVA has proudly partnered with Foundations Community Partnership since 2008.



Clarence W. Winter Charitable Trust

An **\$8,000 grant** from the Clarence W. Winter Charitable Trust helped sustain vital services at the Bucks County Children's Advocacy Center (CAC). These funds supported a coordinated, child-friendly response to serious allegations of abuse—bringing together forensic interviewers, law enforcement, and support professionals to serve young victims and their families. NOVA appreciates the Trust's partnership, which began in 2022.

Rotary Club of Doylestown

NOVA received a **\$5,500 grant** from the Rotary Club of Doylestown to enhance our *SHARE* Program, which offers young people with intellectual and developmental disabilities a supportive space to explore topics such as risk reduction, self-advocacy, and healthy social interactions. A loyal supporter since 2008, the Rotary Club's investment in this program helps foster independence and resilience in our participants.

With a **\$1,500 grant** from the La Mel Garden Fund of the Bucks County Foundation, NOVA was able to implement critical security enhancements at our Perkasio office. These updates ensure that we maintain a safe and welcoming space for clients and staff alike. The La Mel Garden Fund has been a valued supporter of NOVA since 2001.

Through a variety of learning modalities, *SHARE* engages participants and provides a platform for group activities that spark conversations about self-advocacy, risk reduction, positive social connections, protective behaviors, and healthy relationships.
